# Introduction to the 2025–2026 Lectionary Year

(Year A: Gospel of Matthew)

As President of the Uniting Church in Australia, my theme for these three years is "Threads of Love – Weaving Christ's Love Across Cultures and Boundaries." This theme captures what I see and hear as I travel among our communities: Christ at work across difference, drawing us together in hope. Year A of the Revised Common Lectionary invites us into that same story as we walk alongside Jesus through the Gospel of Matthew.



Matthew's account speaks directly to communities seeking to live faithfully in complex times. It is a gospel rooted in Scripture and tradition, yet radically open to the new work of God in Christ. Written for a diverse and often pressured community, Matthew weaves together a story of Jesus as Emmanuel – "God with us" – from his birth to the promise of his abiding presence at the close of the age.


This year we will hear the voice of Jesus the Teacher. Matthew frames Jesus' ministry around five great discourses, echoing the five books of Moses. In these we encounter the Sermon on the Mount with its call to a deeper righteousness; parables of the kingdom that reveal God's upside-down reign; instructions for life together as disciples; and visions of judgment and hope for the nations. Matthew continually invites us to see not only what Jesus does but what it means to follow him: to embody mercy, humility, justice and courage in our own context.

We also hear Matthew's deep concern for the community of faith. This gospel was written for a church learning how to live as Christ's body – struggling with persecution, diversity and change, yet called to bold witness. Matthew names the reality of conflict, but also offers practical teaching for forgiveness, reconciliation and leadership that serves. In a time when our own communities wrestle with similar challenges, these texts ground us again in the transforming presence of Christ.

This Lectionary year invites us to weave these same threads of love in our worship, witness and daily life. It draws our eyes to Jesus who fulfils the law and prophets, who heals and feeds, who calls us to pray "Your kingdom come." May this journey through Matthew renew our discipleship, open our lives more fully to the Spirit, and draw us closer to Emmanuel who makes us one.

### **A Short Guide to Using the Lectionary**

The *Revised Common Lectionary (RCL)* offers for 4 readings for each week, in a three-year cycle:

First Reading from the Old Testament

**Psalm** 

**Second Reading** from the apostles' writings

**Gospel** following a cycle of the synoptic Gospels: Matthew (Year A), Mark (Year B), and Luke (Year C). (The Gospel of John is used as a complement, particularly around Christmas, Lent, and Easter.)

The lectionary encourages us to connect the stories of our lives to the story of God's faithful throughout Scripture. These texts are not simply offered to focus our sermons, but also to shape our prayers and liturgy and song. It is worth keeping in mind these words from the *Basis of Union*:

"The Word of God on whom salvation depends is to be heard and known from Scripture appropriated in the worshipping and witnessing life of the Church." (Paragraph 5)

The connection between Scripture and our worshipping and witnessing life should invite flexibility and pastoral sensitivity in how we use the lectionary. You might choose to follow the lectionary for key seasons: Advent / Christmas, Lent / Easter, and focus on locally chosen texts in other seasons. In places with preachers serving multiple communities, you might follow lectionary texts in different orders so that preachers can take their sermons "on the road" (a common practice of John Wesley).

Lectionaries offer us a sign of unity with other churches who share in the same readings week by week. At the same time, the *RCL* often omits stories about women, and more difficult texts within Scripture. Local leaders should consider making sure the full witness of Scripture is heard across the life of the community. You might consider how often the focus text is the Gospel, rather than the Old Testament reading, for example.

Before Trinity Sunday the Old Testament readings complement the Gospel reading. After Pentecost the Uniting Church follows a semi-continuous narrative within the Old Testament, connections between the Old Testament and Gospel readings are not intentional.

This Uniting Church version of the RCL includes commemorations officially adopted by the Assembly or the World Council of Churches. If these fall on fixed dates, congregations are encouraged to keep those connections. Otherwise, you can observe them at a time and in a way that best fits your local context. The Church in this time celebrates the wonder of the incarnation. (Any of the Nativity selections may be used either for Christmas Day or Christmas Eve services.)

## LENT

A season of preparation and discipline that begins on Ash Wednesday and concludes at sundown on Holy Saturday. During the forty weekdays and six Sundays in Lent, the church remembers the life and ministry of Jesus and renews its commitment to him in Christian discipleship. This season is the traditional time to prepare for baptisms and confirmations to be celebrated at the Easter Vigil or on Easter Sunday, or during the season of Easter.
